

Foreword

The Population and Housing Census was carried out on 25th August 2002, the last Sunday of the month. The 2002 Population and Housing Census was earlier planned to take place on the last Sunday of August, 1998 but was, first postponed to August 1999 and was then postponed again to the last Sunday of August, 2002. The two postponements were necessitated by other very pressing activities that the Government had to carry out.

The Government recognizes the fact that Population and Housing Census is the single most important source of demographic and socio-economic data in the country. Population and Housing Census data are important in the preparation of social and economic development policies, in monitoring improvement in the quality of life of the population and in the establishment of a system of sustainable development. Population and Housing Census data will also provide a sampling frame for intercensal surveys which will be conducted in order to generate policies which will support the implementation process of the Tanzania Development Vision 2025 and the Zanzibar Development Vision 2020 as well as social and economic reforms in a decentralized Government framework.

At the planning level, the Population and Housing Census data will play a central role in the formulation of realistic development plans for the socio-economic development of the people. In the Tanzanian situation where the Government is decentralizing its functions to the district level, reliable and up-to-date Population and Housing Census data will help district authorities to prepare development plans, which will reflect the aspirations of the people.

Given the Government goals of, one, reducing the proportion of Tanzanians living in absolute poverty by the year 2010, and two, of eradicating absolute poverty by the year 2025, the 2002 Population and Housing Census has enabled the Government to get data which will be used to develop poverty status predictors. As such the 2002 Population and Housing Census is an important source of data for poverty monitoring activities. Finally, the 2002 Population and Housing Census has enabled the Government to get data on population growth and distribution by age, sex and location and their relationship to the resource base i.e. their impact on the environment.

By any standards the 2002 Population and Housing Census was conducted professionally. This volume is the first of many other documents, which will be produced during the year as Population and Housing Census data get analysed. This document presents the major findings and contains the total number of people who were enumerated in the country during the census by ward/shehia, district and region. It is our hope that these data will be used effectively for planning purposes at all levels of Government.


A. Descriptive Report

1. Summary of Findings

Number of persons

Since Tanzania achieved independence in 1961 there have been four national population censuses. The population has grown from 12,313,469 persons in the first post-independence census in 1967 to 34,569,232 persons counted in the census held in August 2002. These are shown below in Figure 1.

Figure 1: Population of Tanzania: Census Counts



Over the period from 1967 to 2002 the population of Tanzania has almost tripled. The rate of population growth has varied over this period as shown in Table 1 and Figure 2 below.





Figure 2: Average Annual Growth Rates: 1967 - 2002




The rate of population growth differs from Region to Region as can be seen in Figure 3 and Map 1. The average rates of growth for the period 1988 to 2002 range from 4.8 percent recorded in Kigoma Region to 1.4 percent recorded in Lindi. Other than Kigoma, where much of the growth may be due to the recent influx of refugees, the Regions that show high rates of growth are dominated by large urban areas (Dar es Salaam and Urban West).

Figure 3: Average Annual Growth Rates by Region: 1988 - 2002




Map 1: TANZANIA AVERAGE ANNUAL INTERCENSAL POPULATION GROWTH RATE BY REGION, 1988 - 2002



Population Density

The number of people per square kilometer of land area, or population density, in Tanzania varies considerably from Region to Region. People are particularly concentrated in Dar es Salaam Region (1793 persons per square kilometre) and Urban West (1700 persons per square kilometre). The other four Regions of Zanzibar and Mwanza Region are also relatively densely populated. The relative population densities for regions other than Dar es Salaam and Urban West are illustrated in Figure 4 below. In addition Map 2 shows the current population density for all Regions and Table 2 shows, by Region, how population density has increased since 1967. The greater population density of Zanzibar is clearly shown in that table.

TANZANIA POPULATION DENSITY BY REGION, 2002



Average Household Size

The average household size, calculated by dividing the number of persons by the total number of households, in Tanzania has decreased from 5.2 persons per household in 1988 to 4.9 persons per household in 2002. For Kigoma region the average household size is significantly affected by the treatment of refugee camps in which each enumeration area is treated as a collective household, which gives a lower count of households (and thus higher household size) than would have been the case if each tent had been counted as a household. This will be explained more in the analytical report. For Zanzibar, household sizes have increased for Regions other than South Unguja.

The average household sizes for each Region are shown in Figure 5 below. It is not possible at this stage of data processing to identify separately people counted in private households and in collective households. It is probable that these statistics will be subject to considerable variation when later analysis enables the calculation of average private household sizes. Table 3 shows total population, total number of households and average household size by Region.

Figure 5: Average Household Size by Region: 2002



Sex Ratio

The sex ratio is defined as the number of males per 100 females. In the 2002 Population and Housing Census the sex ratios were the same for Mainland and Zanzibar. Those of Zanzibar show a small decrease since 1988 (see Figure 6 below). Most Mainland Regions had a ratio in the range 94 –99 males per 100 females. The highest ratios were found in Manyara (106 males per 100 females) and Dar es Salaam (102 males per 100 females). The lowest ratios were found in Iringa and Mtwara (both 90 males per 100 females) and Mara (91 males per 100 females). For Zanzibar, South Unguja stands out with a ratio of 103 males per 100 females. The other 4 Regions all show a ratio of 95 or 96 males per 100 females.

Figure 6: Trends in Sex Ratios, Mainland, Zanzibar and Tanzania



2. Census Preparations

Introduction

The 2002 Population and Housing Census is the fourth after independence. The other censuses were carried out in 1967, 1978 and 1988. These censuses provide data for preparation of social and economic development policies, by summarizing the demographic and socio-economic characteristics of the population, and giving a sampling frame to support the implementation process of the Tanzania Development Vision 2025 and Vision 2020 for Zanzibar as well as social and economic reforms in a decentralized government frame work.

Since population censuses provide social and economic measurements that are used as a basis for government policy formulation and planning, it was of vital importance to ensure that the coverage of the 2002 Population and Housing Census is as complete as possible. Like the previous censuses, the 2002 Population and Housing Census, represents a *de facto* count of the population, which aims at covering all the people who were *in the country* on the last Sunday of August 2002, regardless of whether a person is a resident or citizen of the country.

Two types of questionnaires have been used namely the long and short questionnaire. The content of each type of questionnaire is described below.

The night of 24th/25th of August 2002 was used as the reference date in uniformity with the 1967, 1978 and the 1988 censuses, which were undertaken at about the same time. The month of August has traditionally been selected for census taking due to two main reasons. The dry weather facilitates transportation and communication. Second, most farmers have finished harvesting their crops, which means that seasonal labour migration is slightly lower.

Some countries prefer to use the *de jure* concept when carrying out population census, meaning that all people who are registered as residents, regardless of whether or not they are staying in the country at the time of the census, are included in the census population. This concept can however be used only in countries with efficient population register systems, which is not the case for Tanzania.

Training Workshops

Workshops conducted during the 2002 Population and Housing Census cover all the three stages of a census. These stages are pre-enumeration, enumeration and post-enumeration. The following workshops were conducted.

1. Workshop for Regional Planners - early 1997
2. Training of Trainers for cartographic work – April 1997

3. Training of the Field Assistants- May 1997
4. Workshops for the Data Users - 1st phase June 1998 and 2nd phase December 2001
5. Training workshop on pre-test of the census questionnaire – July 1997 and May 2001
6. Training workshops in census quality procedures- June 2001 and June 2002
7. Training of Trainers for the 2001 Pilot Census - July 2001
8. Training of Enumerators and Supervisors for the 2001 Pilot Census – August 2001
9. Workshop on sharing experiences and lessons learnt from the Pilot Census – September 2001
10. Workshop on disseminating results, experiences and lessons learnt during the 2001 Pilot Census to the Members of Parliament and House of Representatives Zanzibar – July 2002
11. Training of Trainers for the main census – July 2002
12. Training of the Regional Level Trainees – July/August 2002
13. Training of the Enumerators and Supervisors – August 2002
14. Workshop on sharing experiences and lessons learnt for the main census- December 2002.

Census Questionnaire Design and Pilot Census Tests

Like in all post independence censuses carried out in Tanzania, all stages of planning and preparations for the 2002 Population and Housing Census were undertaken keeping in mind the basic questions "what is the census for and for whose needs?" In an attempt to answer these questions, the census planners selected the most important topics to be included in the 2002 Population and Housing Census.

The 1988 census formed a natural base for the questionnaire design as information collected from previous censuses had been used to study development and changes between the census years, as well as to work out forecasts. International and SADC recommendations were taken into consideration especially for topics on fertility and mortality.

A list of topics to be included in the census questionnaire was discussed with potential Data Users including development partners. Later on, the census questionnaire was discussed with all census committees.

A Technical Census Committee chaired by the Director General of the National Bureau of Statistics approved the final version of the census questionnaire.

There were two types of census questionnaires namely the long and short questionnaire. The first eight questions, which appeared in both questionnaires, were name, relation to the head of the household, age, sex, marital status, disability and citizenship.

In addition the long questionnaire included extra questions on the following topics;

1. Survivorship of the parents of the person
2. Migration
3. Education for all persons 5 years and above
4. Economic Activity for all persons 5 years and above
5. Fertility of all women aged 12 years and above
6. Mortality
7. Housing conditions

Overall, the long questionnaire comprised 37 questions.

The Sample Design

A list of Enumeration Areas (EAs) was prepared serially for each district, making sure that within each district no ward/shehia was missing and within each Ward/Shehia no village or EA was missed. These lists of EAs served as the sampling frame. After ascertaining the completeness and accuracy of the frame, the urban EAs were then separated from the rural EAs. Both rural and urban EAs were then arranged in ascending order according to codes of Wards/Shehia, village and EAs. It should be pointed out that the sample frame did not take into account the special category EAs of nomadic population, and collective households which all used the short questionnaire.

There were two types of domains of study, rural and urban areas. The sample size for each domain of study in a District depended on the number of EAs as follows;

Rural domain:	up to 199 EAs the sample size was 30 EAs
	200 – 399 EAs the sample size was 40 EAs
	400 and above the sample size was 50 EAs

It should be pointed out that where the total number of rural EAs was less than the designated size or measure of size, all these EAs were included in the sample.

Urban domain: In most urban areas, including the Municipalities of Dar es Salaam Region, the sample size was fixed at 50 EAs. However the Municipalities of Zanzibar and Mwanza had a sample size fixed at 70 EAs.

Recruitment and Training

It was necessary to recruit 16,000 supervisors and 65,600 enumerators and train them for the actual enumeration work. Each supervisor was assigned a maximum of five enumerators.

The training programme was carried out in three phases with those trained in one phase training those at the next lower level.

The purpose of the training was to teach all census workers to carry out the fieldwork and to use correctly the various developed instructions (manuals). Training manuals were developed to standardize the training and reduce the risk of every trainer having their own interpretation on how to carry out the training. A training manual was produced to give guidelines including instructions to every trainer on how to teach trainees to use their own instructions, different materials, etc.

Logistics and Despatch

The logistical arrangements for the 2002 Population and Housing Census were vested in a team known as 2002 Population and Housing Census Logistic Team (CLT). The CLT included members from Zanzibar, Long Term Advisor from Statistics Sweden, Supplies Officers, Local Consultant, Senior Staff from National Bureau of Statistics and Central Census Office.

The overall objective of the CLT was to ensure adequate supply, safe and timely delivery of all census materials to the regions, districts and divisions. It was also charged with the return of questionnaires and non-expendable materials from the field.

At the initial meetings of the CLT the highest priority was attached to establishing arrangements for the outward movements of material to the Regions.

The CLT prepared a form showing the census materials delivery schedule. This schedule depicted the various tasks to be performed, time-intervals, duration of transportation of the training and census materials, sorting out and tentative delivery dates to the regions.

A distribution chart for the 2002 Population and Housing Census materials for all Regions was also prepared for easy implementation. The distribution chart indicated the volume and quantities of all census materials required in the Training Centres for all the regions/districts/divisions e.g. Long and Short questionnaires, Instruction manuals to senior and junior enumerators, Handbooks for RCCs/RSOs and DCEOs, Control Forms, Notebooks, Special Bags, pencils, sharpeners, erasers and other materials.

The first batch of about 39 tons of questionnaires from United Kingdom was safely delivered at Dar es Salaam and cleared within three hours on the 09th July, 2002.

The second and third batches of about 70 and 35 tons of questionnaires were delivered at Dar es Salaam on the 20th July and 30th July, 2002 respectively. These were also cleared very efficiently.

Organizing the Transportation of Census Materials to and from the Regions.

The Census materials were delivered first to the Regions furthest from Dar es Salaam followed by the closer regions. The materials for Districts comprising Dar es Salaam were delivered last.

In order to ensure maximum security of the census materials in transit, the Inspector General of Police issued a special order to the Regional Police Commander for Dar es Salaam to provide Police Officers who escorted the census materials throughout the country.


3. Census Organization

To ensure a successful census, careful planning, monitoring and evaluation of census activities was required at every level. Proper census organization was therefore vital.

A Central Census Committee under the Prime Minister was set up by the government to provide general policy guidelines as well as organize the required resources and generally facilitate the smooth operation of the census programme. The President's Office, Planning and Privatization, was the Government wing which was charged with the responsibility of overseeing the operations of the census project. In Zanzibar, the Ministry of Finance and Economic Affairs was responsible.

The Census was conducted under the supervision of the departments charged with the collection of statistics for both Tanzania Mainland and Tanzania Zanzibar i.e. the National Bureau of Statistics and the Office of the Chief Government Statistician respectively. The day-to-day management was however vested in the Central Census Office and Census Office Zanzibar, which were headed by Commissioner of Population Census and the Census Commissar respectively.

4. Cartographic Work

Introduction

The actual enumeration of the 2002 Population and Housing Census was preceded by the immensely time - consuming cartographic work which not only constituted a prerequisite for the success of enumeration itself but had equally important uses in other areas of national interest.

The main census – related objective of cartographic work can be summarized as to provide delineated maps for the entire area of the country down to the level of Enumeration Areas (EAs) for the census. The most important principle that was to be followed in delineating an EA was that under no circumstance should an EA cut across the existing administrative boundaries of regions, districts, wards/shehia or villages. Strict adherence to this principle was necessary since the census results were to be presented at the level of these administrative units.

The normal size of an EA in urban areas on the Mainland and in Zanzibar (both in rural and urban) lies in the range of 300 to 500. An EA in the rural areas on the Mainland was expected to have between 700 and 900 persons.

Acquisition of Basic Maps and Equipment

The Surveys and Mapping Division of the Ministry of Lands and Urban Development was the main source of basic maps for the 2002 Population and Housing Census. The Central Census Office (CCO) decided that the 1:50,000 maps at the district level were to be used as basic maps for the census cartographic work. It should be noted that for areas not covered by these maps, other maps with different scales were used.

The maps of urban areas were generally available in scales larger than those for rural areas (e.g., 1:2,500, 1:5,000 or 1:10,000). It should also be noted that for some urban and rural areas no maps of any scale existed and thus new maps had to be prepared through the cartographic fieldwork.

Recruitment and Training

At the lowest level, the cartographic fieldwork depended on the work of the Field Assistants who were doing the demarcation work. They mostly worked in a team of 6 in each region and a Team Leader supervised each team. In total there were 246 Field Assistants throughout the country. The teams were under close

supervision of the District Census Executive Officers, who were answerable to the Regional Census Coordinators and the Regional Statistical Officers.

The Regional Census Coordinators in collaboration with the Central Census Office staff did the recruitment of Field Assistants and Team Leaders.

Most of the Field Assistants and the Team Leaders were Form IV and Form VI school leavers who had been trained in cartography or those with passes in mathematics and geography. There were also qualified draughtsmen who were drawing the Supervisory Area (SA) maps.

The training programme for cartographic work was done at two levels; the training of trainers done at Bagamoyo and zonal training done at zonal centres. The participants in the first level training were mainly from: the Central Census Office, the National Bureau of Statistics; Office of the Chief Government Statistician; President's Office, Planning and Privatization as well as the Ministry of Lands and Urban Development. The major training document for the cartographic work was the "Field Assistant's Training Manual" which was prepared by the Cartographic Unit of the Central Census Office.

Delineation Work

The delineation work started at the beginning of June 1997 just after the zonal training. The methods used in delineating the EAs were by listing the heads of households and by structure counting. The first step was to check on the ward/shehia boundaries as they appeared on the District map in the District Census Office. Field Assistants were supposed to consult ward/shehia officials to ascertain such information.

In addition they had to collect information on villages, relating to their boundaries, location and estimated population. These pieces of information were then marked on the field copies (1:50,000) of the base maps.

The second step involved going to each village in the rural areas and to each ward/shehia in the urban areas to collect more information on the street chairpersons and heads of households, population estimates and ascertain village/street boundaries.

Prior information was usually sent to villages/street to prepare such information, but in most cases the work of listing the heads of households was done by the Field Assistants. The estimated number of inhabitants in each village/street helped the Field Assistants to decide on the number of EAs to be delineated in a particular village/street. This work continued until the whole area of every village and hence every ward/shehia, district and region had been assigned to EAs.

5. Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Campaign for the Census

Introduction

The 2002 Population and Housing Census used intensive and extensive IEC programmes in educating, sensitizing and mobilizing the people for the census exercise. The IEC campaign was officially launched with the Uhuru Torch Race on 2nd June 2002 in Sumbawanga. After official launching, low key IEC activities which had been going on since census preparations began, got a new lease of life. The IEC campaign consisted of a number of activities, some of which are described below.

Census IEC Committees

Census IEC Committees were established at national, regional and district levels to deal with education, sensitization and mobilization of the people in their respective regions and districts. Regional and District census committees, which had been established to supervise the preparation for the census, were given an additional role of carrying out IEC campaigns.

Census Mobilization Guidelines

In order to have the same message passed on to the people, census mobilization guidelines were prepared and widely distributed countrywide. The guidelines explained briefly what information should be passed on to the people, the meaning and purpose of the census and the questions to be asked during enumeration.

Census Logo

A census logo was designed and printed for distribution throughout the country. The logo was printed in newspapers, calendars, stickers, leaflets and envelopes to name but a few. The stickers with the logo were also placed at strategic places, including vehicles, in order to remind the people of the census exercise.

Census Sensitization Materials

The census IEC programme also printed some materials as one way of sensitizing the people. These materials included T-shirts, which were of three different colours, caps, "khanga" and "vitenge" which were distributed selectively free of charge.

The Mass Media

The mass media played a major role during the IEC campaign. These included newspapers, radio and television. Dancing troupes, jazz bands and artists of all kinds were deployed to air census messages. The strategy was to intensify the campaign as the enumeration day came closer and during the enumeration exercise.

6. Enumeration Activities

Pre Enumeration

Several activities were done just before the 2002 Population and Housing Census enumeration exercise. These included training of census personnel, distribution of enumeration materials to supervisors and enumerators, identifying the EA boundaries, updating the Heads of Households lists and meeting the local authorities.

The training exercise for the 2002 Population and Housing Census was carried out from the 8th July to 20th August 2002. The training was conducted at three levels:

- the national level (from 08th to 17th July 2002)
- the regional level (from 25th July to 05th August 2002) and
- the divisional level (from 11th to 20th August 2002).

A range of other preparatory activities was carried out from the 20th to the 24th August 2002. The activities included distribution of enumeration materials to supervisors and enumerators, identifying EA boundaries, updating the heads of households' lists (where they were available) and meeting the local authorities in their respective areas.

Zonal Supervisors, Regional Trainers and members of the Quality Control Unit moved through the smaller areas there to make sure that the enumerators were well equipped for the enumeration exercise that started on the 25th August 2002 as scheduled.

At the Central Census Office, Senior Officers were ready for any emergency operation. There was a 24 hours telex service and constant telephone communication between the Central Census Office, the Zonal Supervisors and the Regional Level Trainers. In addition the Central Census Office/Zanzibar Census Office remained open between 6.00 a.m. and 1.00 a.m.

Each Regional Census Coordinator had at their disposal a minimum of two technically trained staff from the Central Census Office. Depending on the population size of the region, some regions had up to 6 technicians.

These staff worked together with the Regional technical team consisting of the Regional Statistical Officer, District Census Executive Officers and their Assistants. The team coordinated and monitored census activities in all districts within each region.

At the district level, the District Census Executive Officer was at the centre of all census activities within the District. His/her team included an assistant and all enumerators and supervisors within that district. At every divisional centre there were reserve enumerators who remained behind for any unexpected eventuality in the field such as sudden illness, drop outs, etc.

Enumeration

The District Census Executive Officer and their Assistant dealt more with coordination and administrative census matters (distribution of census materials, transport, finance, etc). Supervisors and enumerators were the field workers, doing the actual enumeration. A maximum of 5 enumerators worked under one supervisor. Each enumerator, with the help of village/vitongoji/street chairpersons, moved from one household to another, within his/her EA, until all households were covered.

Guiding maps (EAs and SAs), were provided to help the enumerator to avoid omission and/or double counting.

In addition, all levels of supervisory staff carried some extra enumeration materials, when moving around their supervisory areas. These materials were distributed to enumerators who had run out of enumeration materials.

There were two categories of enumerators; senior and junior enumerators. During enumeration junior enumerators used the short questionnaire while the senior enumerators used the long questionnaire. The short questionnaire was administered to 75 percent of all EAs, while the long questionnaire was administered to the remaining 25 percent. All questions in the short questionnaire were contained in the long questionnaire.

Each enumerator was supposed to cover one EA irrespective of whether the EA was in an urban area or in a rural area.

For passengers, enumerators were stationed at the point of embarkation and disembarkation to enumerate them. Special census tags indicating that they had been enumerated were issued to every enumerated person to avoid double counting. During enumeration, the enumerators were instructed to compile EA summaries so that the total population for each household and each EA was recorded in the SWT 15A form.

The earmarked duration for enumeration was 10 days, from 25th August – 4th September 2002.

In most areas the enumeration exercise was completed within that period. However in some areas, enumeration could not be completed within the 10 days period due to various reasons. Most of these areas were those where the long questionnaire was administered and some of those EAs that were created in 1997/98. Nevertheless, by the 14th September 2002 the enumeration exercise was completed in all EAs.

Post Field Enumeration Activities

Checking of the enumerators' work by the supervisors was a continuous exercise throughout the enumeration period. When the enumeration was over and the supervisor was satisfied with the completeness of the questionnaires, he/she collected the questionnaires and the other census materials and handed them to the District Census Executive Officer (DCEO).

Most DCEOs used some of the supervisors and senior enumerators to check the accuracy and completeness of the questionnaires from the field. Using the summaries on SWMT 15A form that was compiled by the enumerators, the DCEOs were able to compile the population totals for each ward/shehia and district disaggregated by gender on another summary sheet, the SWMT 16A. The SWMT 16A summary sheets were an important input to confirming the correct preparation of all the tables in this report.

Thereafter, the questionnaires and the summaries were transported to the Regional Census Office from where they were transported to the data processing site in Dar es Salaam. Before the Regional Census Coordinator could transport the questionnaires to Dar es Salaam he/she contacted the Central Census Office so that they could together arrange for safe transportation of those questionnaires to Dar es Salaam.

7. Evaluation and Quality Control Activities

Introduction

Evaluation and Quality Control measures were undertaken in three stages namely: pre enumeration, enumeration and post enumeration. At each stage quality standards were established and maintained to minimize errors in the Population and Housing Census undertaking.

Pre Enumeration stage

During this stage the Evaluation and Quality Control Unit worked hand in hand with the respective units to make sure that quality was observed to the required standards. This involved mainly the cartographic work, questionnaire design, information education and communication, and training of enumerators and supervisors.

Cartographic Work

On census mapping, the supervisors from the Central Census Office assessed the work of the Field Assistants and made sure that they corrected mistakes and reported to the Central Census Office for resolution of difficult cases. In order to increase the accuracy of the maps the Team Leaders used the Global Positioning System (GPS) to make sure that the recorded coordinates were correct for each enumeration area.

Questionnaire Design

Evaluation and Quality Control Unit co-operated effectively with the Planning and Analysis Unit as well as with Data Processing Unit to design, develop and improve the census questionnaire and related documents.

Information, Education and Communication (IEC)

The Evaluation and Quality Control Unit evaluated the census messages in cooperation with the IEC Unit.

Training of enumerators and supervisors

The Evaluation and Quality Control Unit evaluated the quality of training materials and monitored the training at all levels

Enumeration stage

During enumeration quality control procedures stressed correct filling in of the questionnaires, and by observing a sample of interviews, ensured correct interpretation and presentation of questions; proper shading and handling of questionnaires in the field and consistency checks for questions.

Post Field Enumeration Stage

The Evaluation and Quality Control Unit ensured quality handling of questionnaires to and from the field, quality storage facilities, quality editing specifications of questionnaires.

Post Enumeration Survey (PES)

The Evaluation and Quality Control Unit conducted the first Post Enumeration Survey (PES) in the country ten weeks after the census enumeration. It was undertaken on a sample basis in which, 915 Enumeration Areas (EAs) selected to cover all districts in the country, were revisited. All households in the sampled EAs for the PES were enumerated, representing 1.7 percent of the census-enumerated EAs.

The PES results will be used to determine the coverage and content errors of the census. In addition, it will be used to evaluate the quality of enumeration areas as a sampling unit for intercensal and household based surveys and will also furnish information on sources and causes of errors.

8. Data Processing

Introduction

The plans for processing of the 2002 Population and Housing Census began in May 2000 when a report by three consultants outlined two approaches to data capture i.e. manual keying and scanning. They felt that since Tanzania would be carrying out a census 14 years after the last census it would be advisable to adopt data capture technology which would enable the country to get results after a relatively short time frame. This recommendation was made in view of the experience in earlier censuses which showed that using manual keying as a method of data capture resulted in final results being available after a minimum period of two years. It was suggested that scanning method of data capture be adopted in order to get census results out within a short time frame. The scanning approach for data capture has three variants. These are the Optical Mark Recognition (OMR) and Optical Character Recognition (OCR) and the Intelligent Character Reading (ICR).

It was however found that each of the data capture alternative requires a local area network for its implementation and the load on the network is fairly light if keying is the method of data capture but is at its highest if image capture and automatic extraction is used.

After studies made in countries that had used the new technologies for data capture like Zambia (OMR) and South Africa (OCR) it was decided that the OMR technology be adopted and first tested during the pilot census; if successful, be used for the main census. The Pilot Census was successful (the scanning acceptance rate was 98.29 percent) and the OMR technology was accepted. The total package approach from one supplier was the key to choice of technology. Training for capacity building for permanent staff training began well in advance by providing training in IMPS/CSPro and use of OMR technology.

Regardless of the methods of data capture that is adopted, some basic operations are common to all. There must be sufficient storage for all questionnaires, sufficient temporary storage adjacent to the data entry and cleaning operation, and proper arrangements be made for logging the movement of forms.

Recruitment and Training of Temporary staff

Recruitment of temporary staff was done after advertisement in the local papers for application in various computer related fields. The main criterion for selection was knowledge in use of computers. Oral interviews as well as practical tests were conducted and 300 personnel were selected and they worked for 24 hours in three shifts of 100 each.

Training was done for two weeks before scanning began. This training included practicals on how to prepare, register and validate the questionnaires. The smallest unit for data processing was the EA.

Receipt of questionnaires

Questionnaires began arriving from the field on 16th September 2002 and the last questionnaires were received on 8th October 2002, one week before scanning began. Thorough checking was done to ensure complete receipt as per the inventory.

Scanning of Questionnaires

This phase began as planned on 15th October 2002 and was completed in 26 days; an average of one region a day. Final checks were carried out to ensure that all EAs were scanned before production of General Report tables. The scanning acceptance rate was 99.91 percent. The preparation of these General Report tables was completed by January 9th 2003, less than three months from the start of scanning and less than four months after the Census Day.

Later data processing activities

Following the successful completion of scanning the data from all questionnaires the information will be cleaned and checked for consistency. An initial set of tabulations has been prepared.

Later tasks will involve preparing more detailed tabulations for inclusion in publications and to satisfy special purpose requirements.

Data back-ups will be made and the data will be extensively disseminated.

9. Planned Publications

Introduction

The following publications are expected to be produced in relation to the 2002 Population Census of Tanzania.

General Report

This publication contains population by sex, numbers of households and average household size for: Wards/Shehias; Districts and Regions for; Mainland; Zanzibar and Tanzania. 
































